Two community choir groups are joining to present a concert about Life & Love. The Mid Canterbury Choir Mid Canterbury Choir, directed by Jocelyn Jones and accompanied by Deborah Sloper will sing some well-known songs, including Can You Feel the Love Tonight, Somewhere out There and Life is Better when you Sing.

The Selwyn Community Choirs lead and accompanied by mother and son duo Caelan Thomas and Lynley Thomas is made up of an adult choir, the Selwyn Youth Choir and the Treble Rebels (a development group, taken from the Youth Choir). Their songs include Fixer Upper from Frozen, Hard Knock Life from Annie.

The choirs will combine to present Te Aroha (Love), Somebody to Love and Circle of Life.

Background

The Mid Canterbury Choir was formed to wow the people of Mid Canterbury with some wonderful music! The choir met for the first time in November 2002 for a day workshop of choral music. The choir meets for weekly rehearsals and has developed a considerable repertoire in a wide range of music.

Aims (taken from our Charitable Trust document)

1 To promote and foster the formation of an amateur choir in Ashburton

2 To promote and encourage choral singing for the benefit of the public in Mid Canterbury and elsewhere.

3 To promote, organise and conduct public concerts of choral music in Ashburton and elsewhere.

Ø we also want to foster the return of successful local musicians to perform with us – we are planning this as part of our first Christmas concert

4 To promote and encourage education in all matters relating to choral singing and choral music generally.

Ø several choir members teach music both in local schools and privately. They have commented how their choir training has enhanced their teaching techniques and they have noticed improvement in their own students

Choir Leadership Choir Leadership

Anthony Ferner is leading the choir from June 2015. Lois Johnston was our interim director for the first part of 2015. Sylvia Watson was the inaugural Musical Director of the Mid Canterbury Choir - she retired from her position with the

choir in December 2014. The Accompanists are Deborah Sloper and Kathy McKimmie (relief). Lynne Judkins is Choir Leader, assisting the Musical Director when required. Carol Gunn is the choir manager, taking responsibility for the day-to-day running of the choir. In 2009, Sylvia Watson took a year of leave and we welcomed John Pattinson (February to May) and Carolie Andrew (May to December) as Acting Musical Directors. Joan Wilkinson was the inaugural accompanist of the Mid Canterbury Choir.

Practice Venue

The Bradford Room at the Ashburton Trust Event Centre, Mondays 7.15-9.15pm. Dress rehearsals at the various venues prior to a performance.

Musical Style

The Choir's repertoire is drawn from music of the 15th Century to present day, both a cappella and accompanied, sacred and secular, from classic to popular.

Membership

Current membership sits at 60 – a good cross section of Sopranos, Altos, Tenors and Basses from the wider Mid Canterbury area - Methven, Geraldine, Rakaia, Leeston and of course, Ashburton.

From time to time, a small semi-chorus is drawn from the choir - those with more musical experience and expertise. Choir members are also given the opportunity to perform solo parts. Most performances are without music, with many pieces performed unaccompanied.

Incorporated Society/Charitable Trust

Our Solicitor, Alister Argyle, has undertaken the required documentation to make us an Incorporated Society, and a Charitable Trust.

Admission to the Choir

New members will be contacted at one of two times per year (early in the year and mid-year) and offered an audition to join the choir.

Funding Support

Choir members pay an annual subscription (currently \$80). Our main sponsor is Argyle Welsh Finnigan.

Now registered with the Choral Federation, we believe touring choirs will include Ashburton in their itinerary, as they often require a district choir to support their programme.

Purchase of Kawai Grand Piano for Ashburton Performing Arts Centre

In August 2006 a fundraising committee took on the task of raising \$27,800 to purchase the grand piano for the new Ashburton Trust Event Centre. This took the form of selling and tendering keys, these being recorded on a "giant" keyboard. We reached our target and now enjoy using the Grand Piano in the Ashburton Trust Event Centre.
